Christine Van Der Hurd has been making artisanal rugs for 35 years, seeking to preserve traditional weaving by continually innovating. You'll find her designs at Annabel's, Kit Kemp's Finsbury Hotel and the V&A. If you're a sucker for a kilim, you won't fail to fall for Vanderhurd's new Amelia Truss collection. The rugs use a hand-woven sumac construction, which is a tapestry technique of weaving that is stronger and thicker than a kilim, with a smooth front face and textured reverse.
